This year, we've been blessed again with an incredible grant through Childcare International. Many of you have sent financial support as well!

We're excited to say that this funding will allow us to help another 60 to 70 families in need as well as rebuild at least three churches severely damaged during last year's earthquakes. We plan to begin the work in February as part of a two-week trip Christopher will make to the country.

Bruce Ingram - He had only five days to re-book last year's canceled flights to Ethiopia. He shared this prayer request with John Blake whose response was that he would like to join Bruce in training pastors in Ethiopia and has contacts there! Three days later, they met with missionary to Ethiopia. He shared how training pastor was a real desire of his heart for 8 years. The Ethiopian trip is planned for August. Please pray also for preparations and provisions for February 26 - March 13th Pastor Training in Myanmar. Bruce and Paul Ehrhard will be in three different locations with three people groups.
